The Hospice Resale Shop has officially cut the ribbon for their new location in Mt. View! It was a wonderful day as CEO Dana Killian and Board Chair of the Foundation, Darrell Johnson shared about the impact the Hospice Resale Shop has on the community and Carolina Caring.

The Hospice Resale Shop Mt. View has performed exceptionally well since its doors first opened in August of 2024. In September, the first full month of operation since the store's opening, the shop had sales comparable to it's sister store in Viewmont. "It took us 4 years to get to this sales level at Viewmont," says Charity Hand, Manager of The Hospice Resale Shops. "First day sales were nearly double the best sales day we have ever had in the history of The Hospice Resale Shop."
